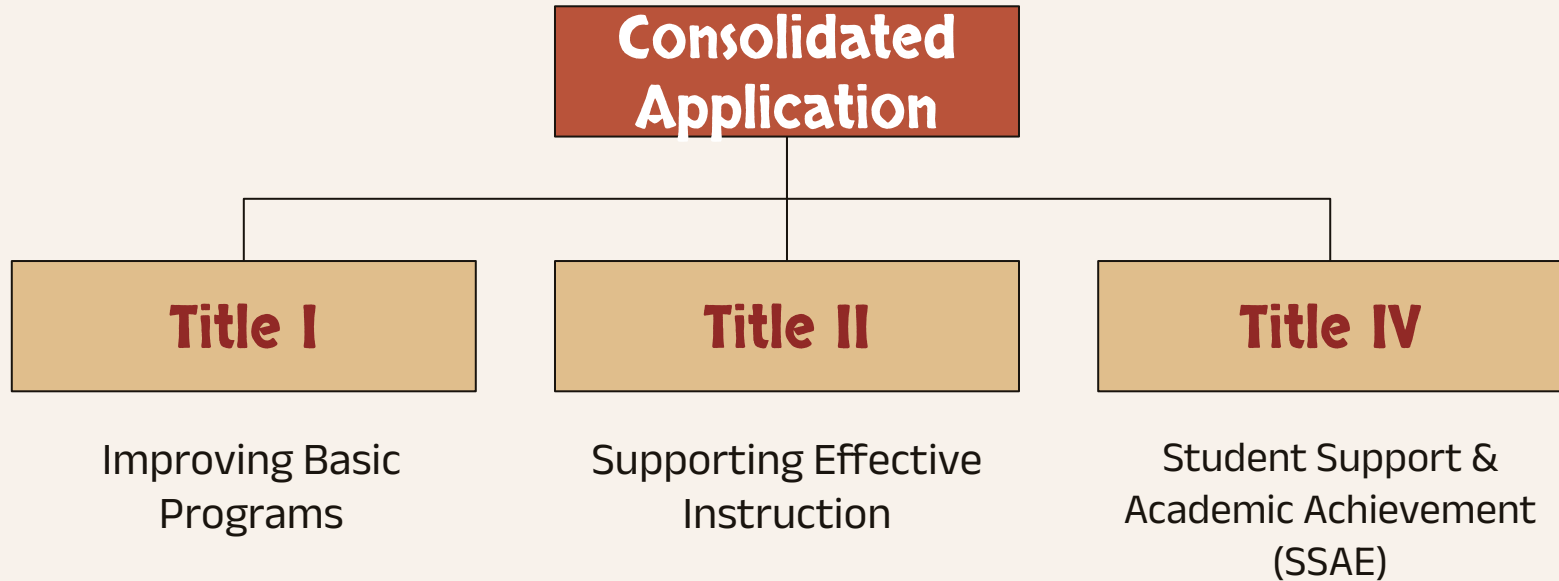

PDE Federal Programs Funding



Title II

The purpose of Title II is to provide supplemental activities that strengthen the quality and effectiveness of teachers, principals, and other school leaders. These funds are allowed to be reallocated into another Federal Program, which we chose to do - Title I.

Title IV

Title IV is intended to provide all students with access to a well-rounded education. LEAs receiving less than \$30k can roll this funding into another Federal Program, which we chose to do- Title I.



Title III

Title III funding concentrates on delivering language instruction to students who have a primary language other than English. LTSD is part of the NEIU #19 Title III Consortium.



Title I Schoolwide Program



Title I is the largest Federally funded program. It is intended to improve educational opportunities for economically disadvantaged children. Title I programs are designed to help children meet the state content and performance standards in reading, language arts, and mathematics. **In buildings with 40% or more poverty, LEAs may use the funds to upgrade the entire curriculum of the school and are Schoolwide Programs.**
